

## Gospel Reflection: Luke 16: 19-31

One of the reasons this story is so powerful is because of the clear descriptive contrast between the rich man and Lazarus. In the first contrast, the rich man's life seems much more desirable, at least on the surface. He is rich, has a home to live in, dresses in fine clothing and eats sumptuously every day. By contrast, Lazarus is poor, has no home, has no food, is covered with sores and even endures the humiliation of dogs licking his wounds. Which of these persons would you prefer to be?

When they both die, they experience very different eternal fates. When the poor man died, he was "carried away by angels." And when the rich man died, he went to the netherworld, where there was ongoing torment. So again, which of these persons would you prefer to be?

One of the most seductive and deceptive realities in life is the lure of riches, luxury and the fine things in life. Though the material world is not bad in and of itself, there is great temptation that goes along with it. In fact, it is clear from this story and from the many other teachings of Jesus on this topic that the lure of riches and its effect on the soul cannot be ignored. Those who are rich in the things of this world are often tempted to live for themselves rather than living for others. When one has all the comforts this world has to offer, it's easy to simply enjoy those comforts without concern for others. And that is clearly the unspoken contrast between these two men.

Though poor, it is clear that Lazarus is rich in the things that matter in life. This is evidenced by His eternal reward. It is clear that in his material poverty, he was rich in charity. The man who was rich in the things of this world was clearly poor in charity and, thus, upon losing his physical life, he had nothing to take with him. No eternal merit. No charity. Nothing.

## **UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS ISSUE CALL TO END UKRAINE WAR**

The Ukrainian Catholic Bishops in Canada have issued a Pastoral Letter calling for continued Prayer, Fasting and Action to end the tragic War in Ukraine. The letter is issued in view of the annual commemoration on the last Saturday of November of the Holodomor – Genocide, the man-made famine in Ukraine that claimed millions of lives during 1932-1933. Addressed to the faithful in Canada and to all people of good will, the bishops urge a response of faith to the evil of war, violence and death.

**The Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of Sts Vladimir and Olga is organizing a Christmas campaign called "Become St. Nicholas for the Children of Fallen Heroes".**

In Ukraine, the Feast of St. Nicholas on December 19 is an opportunity for children to receive small gifts from St. Nicholas, rewarding them for good behaviour and reminding them of God's love and His endless blessings.

This year, we do not know what the Feast of St. Nicholas will be like for those in Ukraine. What we do know is that this time of year will look and feel very different. In some homes, family members will be missing from the table this Christmas. In others, children will wake up on the Feast of St. Nicholas without any toys, because their parents have been killed in the war, and they have been left orphaned. This tragedy is the unescapable reality of what is taking place in Ukraine right now. **This year, the Cathedral is working with the Drohobych SOS Volunteer Organization to collect and deliver donations to make this year's Feast of St. Nicholas and Christmas a bit easier for families in Ukraine. In particular, we are focusing this year's campaign on children of Heroes who have died in the war.**

We are collecting the following items, in addition to financial donations:

- Pencils
- Paints
- Felt-tip pens
- Notebook or Colouring Book
- Toys
- Socks
- Gloves
- Hats
- Hair elastics
- Hairbrushes
- Toothbrushes
- Toothpaste
- Vitamins
- Candies

**Items will be collected until Tuesday, November 15, 2022**, so as to ensure that the donations arrive in Ukraine on time. Items can be brought to Sts. Vladimir and Olga Cathedral during the week from 10:00am to 3:00pm, or we can arrange to have donations picked up from your parish.
